### **CITY COUNCIL MEETING RE-CAP – DECEMBER 6TH, 2022**

#### **RECOGNITIONS AND PROCLAMATION:**

- **10.1:** City Council proclaimed Wednesday, December 7<sup>th</sup>, 2022 as Arbor Day.
- **10.2:** Mayor Lincoln recognized out-going Council Members Sol Jobrack, District 1; Paul Canepa, District 3; Christina Fugazi, Vice Mayor, District 5.

#### **CONSENT ITEMS:** City Council approved 8 Consent Agenda Items including:

- **12.4:** City Council authorized the appointment of Aisha Abercrombie, Maurice Spiller, and Irie Woods to the Stockton Arts Commission.
- **12.6:** City Council approved years 2 and 3 of Flavor Fest Programming. Stockton welcomed it's first "Flavor Fest" community festival in May of 2022, celebrating food, music, and cultural diversity in Stockton. The two-day event saw over

11,000 attendees with 32 global food vendors, 49 artist/merchant vendors, and hours of cultural and musical entertainment. The 2023 Flavor Fest will expand to a 3-day festival taking place May 19<sup>th</sup> - 21<sup>st</sup>.

**NEW BUSINESS:** City Council received informational updates and/or acted on 3 new business items including:

- **15.2:** City Council adopted a resolution approving the development of a City Summer Jobs Youth pilot program and approving 4 subgrantees to implement Youth Workforce Development programs in Stockton. The main objectives of these programs are to increase youth employment, develop career pathways, and strengthen city/community capacity to address key areas of food insecurity, climate, and COVID-19 recovery.

The **City of Stockton Summer Jobs Youth pilot program** is aiming to serve 225 youth participants. Total funding allocated to the City of Stockton Youth pilot program is \$1,762,692.

The Californians For All Youth Workforce Grant allotted \$4,355,097 to the City of Stockton, as a result of Mayor Lincoln’s advocacy efforts with the Big City Mayor’s Coalition.
